## Overview of the Art Therapy Profession in Europe - Survey

**Aim:** Create an overview of the professional situation of art therapy in Europe

- Define the professional practice:
  - Number of art therapists, professional organizations, certificates ...
  - Theoretical backgrounds, work contexts, target groups ...
  - Problems, methods, interventions, aims, results ...
- Contribute to the foundations of NEAT and the future European Art Therapy organization by providing the statistics needed for backing claims with authorities.
- 5 Skype meetings took place between October 2016 and April 2017

## Accomplished tasks:

- Review of existing literature & of information about other surveys into art therapy: Vicky Karkou / UK, Johannes Junker / Germany (via Maria d'Elia)
- Development of a research plan:

What kind of questionnaire? Aim of the research? Qualitative or quantitative?

- —> Both quantitative and qualitative data will be gathered
- Exchange of information with NEAT WG Professional Identity re: overlap
- Agreement with HR educations Stenden University Leeuwarden (Netherlands): Jacqueline Rietveld, prof. At HR education

- Information about ownership of research material and results: Willem Bakker, Stenden hogeschool Leeuwarden (NL).
- Informing HR students about Art Therapy as a profession and NEAT: Celine Schweizer (NL)
- Preparation of directions for HR students of Stenden University, Leeuwarden / Netherlands, who will perform research in different stages:
  - Interviews of Art Therapists in 5 different countries as a qualitative pilot study to gather information for the EU Survey. This study was finished by July.

## **Next steps / focus / tasks:**

• September – December, 2017: quantitative survey in all NEAT Countries?

Long term: Eventually, a publication is planned

## Other points of attention

- Need: **commitment & agreement** of NEAT members to involve as many art therapists in their country as possible.
- Celine is contact person for the Working Group at Stenden University
- During the meeting in Luxembourg there seemed to be an overlap with the WG Professional identity. This overlap has been growing despite of communication during the period before the April NEAT meeting. During the NEAT meeting we tried to clarify about this overlap by talking with both WG's, and the issues seemed to be solved. However, during the presentation of the WG Professional Identity a new confusion arose and it seems as if the overlap still exists. Our WG decided to continue our plans and see what happens.

At the Luxembourg meeting there was great enthusiasm which we will need to make this happen!

## **Professional Identity**

Our two new members are Avgustina and Martina joined us during the Luxembourg meeting, whereas Nicole was not able to attend.

## Our projects:

• Our first activity was the creation of a Professional Identity Survey to be distributed among art therapists in Europe that would yield important information about different facets influencing the professional identity of art therapists in Europe. A preliminary version was distributed to NEAT members to test the efficacy of the survey and to find out what improvements were needed. We were pleased to have had 41 responses, or approximately 2/3 of the NEAT membership and mostly positive feedback. Responses included quite a few write-in answers that were very helpful to us. We were very pleased that evaluation tools and graphs are now automatically built into the Google survey, which means that once the deadline for taking the survey arrives, finding out the results are automatically known.

We decided that a few revisions to the survey were necessary: a clearer introduction/instructions and a section describing philosophical/psychological approaches to clinical practice, supervision and personal therapy. We omitted the latter at first to keep the survey as short as possible. We felt that the more streamlined it would be, the more participants would be encouraged to take it and answer questions until the end. However, we decided that this element would add important information so should be included.

Translating the survey into several European languages will require work by a few volunteers. We hope that art therapists in Europe will be able to take the survey in French, Spanish, German and Italian. Translations into other languages not mentioned will always be welcomed. We will send out a call for translators as soon as the updated survey is ready.

- Our second planned project is to collect definitions of the profession of art therapy based upon gathering definitions from professional national art therapy associations and other art therapists. We will use results of our survey to help inform our definitions. This project will begin once the survey has been dispatched to the various countries.
- During the Luxembourg meeting, we were grateful for the suggestion of Paola Luzzatto to collect actual stories of art therapists and compile them into book form to examine the professional identity of the art therapist. All members of our WG are very enthusiastic about pursuing this project, whose aim would be publication. Some members felt that we ought to discontinue the survey effort and begin the story collection process right away. However, considering the great effort we already put into the survey, and the fact that we are so close to disseminating it.

## Our present status:

Normally our WG meets at least once a month on Skype. However, since the Luxembourg meeting, members have been very busy with other commitments. Therefore, the regularity of our meetings along with our productivity has slackened off. That said, we have been a very committed and dedicated group and do intend to resume our active participation in the near future.
